COVID update

In school

You will have seen from the ParentMail yesterday that we have reported a positive case in the kitchen this week. All advice and guidance was sought and we are very lucky that we have not had to close any bubbles in school at this time.

You will undoubtedly hear (probably through class WhatsApp groups) about children or parents who may be symptomatic or sent home ill. I wanted to confirm with you all that if a child has symptoms, there is no action for the school to take. The child will need to get a test and if the test comes back as positive then there is likely to be action for the school to take – this is why it is so important that you email me at

headteacher@palacewood.kent.sch.uk as soon as the result comes back. I will be

checking emails regularly, including evenings and weekends. The more notice I have, the quicker we can move to take the actions recommended to us by the DfE and PHE.

Outside of school – post Lockdown 2

I imagine that you will have seen the news from yesterday that at the end of this Lockdown, Kent has been placed in Tier 3. I understand that this may cause unrest, especially as Kent is such a large county and in our particular area, the cases are not as significant as other areas of Kent. I am, however, imploring you to stick to the guidelines for Tier 3 to help keep the community safe as you have done throughout.

Christmas Support

Another thing that has been in the news a lot recently, largely due to Marcus Rashford's campaigning, is supporting families over the Christmas period. We know that the pandemic has had a significant impact on many families. As a school, one way we can support is through the Free School Meals offer. If your child is Eligible for Free School Meals, school will provide your child with a meal every day, and the government have also agreed to provide meal vouchers over the Christmas period. We will be sending a ParentMail to all eligible families today asking for some additional information so that the vouchers can be allocated accurately. If you think you may be eligible for Free School Meals, please follow this link and complete the information – it doesn't take too long I promise, and the information remains confidential.

Spelling League Table


This week, our top three classes are:

1st position - Lions 2nd position - Rhinos 3rd position - Monkeys (As of 27/11/20)




