If you have any newspaper at home, that you are able to spare, please send it in to school as we are hoping to build a giant Pudsey Bear.




## EYFS


## YEAR 2

In Science we have been discussing what a healthy diet consists of and in Geography we have been learning what a settlement is. 


## YEAR 4
