### Courage, Challenge, Curiosity, Compassion

Dear Parents and Carers,

There are 3 weeks until the Christmas holidays and it has certainly started to feel festive in school. I'm regularly hearing carols being sung, which is such a lovely sound and not one that we've heard in school for a while. We have been frantically planning a number of festive activities for the children, over the next 3 weeks, and are trying to make up for some of the events they missed last year. As I mentioned in a previous letter, we have 4 new Palace Wood values - courage, challenge, compassion and curiosity.









This week and for the next two weeks we will be focusing on courage and what it means to be brave and face our fears. In assemblies and our lessons we will be learning about courage. We will look at examples of people in history who have shown courage and reflect on the times when we have been brave. We will learn that bravery and courage doesn't just relate to physical feats but also to our daily words and actions such as being honest even if this might mean we get into trouble for something.


### Year One – Bears and Giraffes



In Science we have been continuing our focus on diet. In PSHE we discussed gender stereotypes and how we shouldn't limit ourselves because of our gender. In DT we made a practice of our frames that we will be making in the near future. For Geography we learnt about some of the different types of settlement including; dispersed, nucleated, linear and isolated. Finally in PE we introduced unison and cannon into our dance routines and continued with our tag rugby skills.






