## **EYFS**



This week we welcomed our new children into EYFS! Elephants and Penguins arrived at school on their first day wearing smart new uniforms, shiny shoes and big smiles on their faces! We have had lots of fun exploring all the different areas of the classrooms, sharing stories together and making new friends. We have been busy playing outside in the sunshine-cooking up a storm in the mud kitchen, practising our skills on the balance bikes, enjoying water play and lots more! Well done EYFS, what a fantastic first week you've had!







This week the children enjoyed taking their Science lesson outside. We are learning all about ourselves and this week focused on the human body. The children used chalk to draw around their bodies on the playground and then used picture cards with the key words to label their body parts.







This week in Year Two the children were lucky enough to have the PE coaches for a tennis lesson. The children all worked really hard with a range of skills working up to using the racket to play tennis hockey!









This week in year 3 we have started reading 'The Stone Age Boy' and experimenting with a variety of language including prepositional phrases and expanded noun phrases. In Maths we have we reviewing our learning on Place Value and have begun talking about 'hundredths'. In Science we will be learning about Rocks this term and did an experiment to find our which rocks were permeable, durable and dense. In History we begun our journey learning about the stone age and discussed the origins of life on Earth. In Music we are going to be working on our singing this term and learning a variety of songs. Finally in RE we have been discussing what different people believe about God. We have had a fantastic first week back!









This week in Year 4 we have been to Mote Park to take part in our first swimming lesson of this term using front crawl to travel from one side of the pool to the other. In Art we have been using mirrors, colouring pencils and chalk to draw and colour our own self-portraits. In Science we have been exploring the school to investigate all of the different sounds we can hear in different locations. We were able to hear lots of different things such as cars, children playing and birds.









Year 5 had a wonderful couple of afternoons with the new EYFS children. They officially met their buddies on Friday and Monday and chatted and played showing how grown up and wonderfully responsible they could be. The Year 5's collected their buddies from the gate and made sure that they were happy and safe for the time they were in their brand new school. The Year 5's really remember being in EYFS themselves so were able to make sure they felt ok at Palace Wood. They have been fabulous ambassadors for the school and will be amazing buddies throughout this year.









This week, Year 6 enjoyed investigating how card games work and how different strategies and variables can affect the outcome. For example, when playing Cheat, it is far easier to win if there are only two players than if there are three. We have also worked hard at creating self- portraits, comparing our current art skills with those in previous years and ready to compare with the end of the year.


