We have been so very lucky in EYFS this week. One of our lovely parents, very kindly gave us two baby chicks, newly hatched, to foster this last week. The children have enjoyed watching them grow and caring for them. We will miss them in term 5.



YEAR 1



Year 1 have been working hard on their DT skill this term to fasten two things together by sewing. Each child designed and made their own bunting flag, then used a running stitch to attach their piece of bunting to the ribbon. You might be lucky enough to see our bunting flying under the Year 1 canopy after Easter as it becomes part of our garden centre decoration!



This week during English year 2 have been learning about non-chronological reports. We looked at the features such as subheadings. Then we planned and we wrote our own reports on owls. We included information on their appearance, diet and habitat. We did such an amazing job including noun phrases and commas in our sentences with capital letters and full stops that we published them and turned them into a class book which is now in our book corner for everyone to read.



YEAR 3



This week, Year 3 have been looking at their sunflower experiment in Science. They planted their seeds in cups at the beginning of term, some had no water, no light and some were too hot. They discussed how important it is for plants to have all these things. They then planted their sunflowers which had everything outside their classroom. Fingers crossed they keep growing!

YEAR 5



In Year 5 this week, we have finished out unit in geography on Biomes and have written some excellent essays on this subject. In Science, we have built on our geography work looking at lines of latitude to looking at lines of longitude and how this affects time zones. We used maps to locate countries and identify their time zones.



Year 6 have continued learning about the impact of key events during WW1 and WW2. This week we looked at whether the Treaty of Versailles was fair and its consequences for the next two decades. We are continuing with our electricity topic and investigated circuits further by creating burglar alarms.
