YEAR3





This week in Year 4 we have been investigating the relationship between tenths as a fraction and as a decimal. In English we have been working on our expanded noun phrases to describe the forest and the castle. In science we have been investigating habitats and what living things live in these habitats and have been enjoying athletics and basketball in our P.E sessions.
