Year 5 thought about our school community and wrote letters and baked cookies for the people who help them and look after them each day such as the office staff, the care taking team and the dinner team.


Year 6 are sorting and bagging up the donations for the church and will be delivering the parcels to the church next week.



Congratulations to Max, who found out that tomorrow he has been chosen to play as goalkeeper at the Crystal Palace training ground. Awesome achievement Max!










SUPERSTAR CORNER

YEAR 1


