Dear Parents and Carers,





YEAR 1




This week Year 1 have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes.

The children are able to identify how many sides and corners a 2D shape has. They are beginning to learn the vertices, edges and faces of 3D shapes too!



This term in Science we are learning about 'Living Things And Their Habitat'. So far we have identified 4 main habitats; ocean, Artic, desert and rainforest. In small groups we then researched and presented to the rest of the class information about why a polar bear would not survive in the rainforest and why a shark would not survive in the desert.



YEAR 3




Year 3 have had an incredible Arts Week this week and have thoroughly enjoyed a range of activities including: dance, drama, singing, music and storytelling!





This week in Year 4 we have been studying perimeter. We have enjoyed measuring different shapes and learning about how millimeters, centimeters, meters and kilometers can be converted by multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000.



YEAR 5



Year 5 have worked hard understanding the poem The Highwayman by Alfred Noyes. Tigers did a remarkable job of understanding and predicting what would happen in the text. They read it well with intonation and asked interesting and relevant questions – next task : writing our own version!



Year 6 have been learning how to identify features of an OS map and can now use 6 figure grid references. Now you will have no excuse for getting lost! We have combined maths and science this week; drawing line graphs to present data from our investigations. One of which was 'does the distance between a light source and an opaque object affect the length of its shadow?'


