


Ella has recently started playing football and at football training this week she won a medal for her determination. Well done, Ella


Seb got player of the match at the weekend for his team Castle Colts. Scoring two goals.

He's also been invited this coming Saturday to Crystal Palace to play the academy team as part of his Palace academy training. Great work, Seb





This term we have been discussing friendships and how they are important to us as humans as we are quite sociable beings and how it is lovely to make new friends.


We have been thinking back to a time when we made a friend. For example, when we started at school, a club and when we were at a party.

YEAR 3


